Advent Wreath

Reader 1: No matter what troubles overwhelm us today, Isaiah reminds us that in all of our preparation and passionate pursuit of God's coming kingdom, we must not forget that God's salvation has come and is coming. "With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation". With joy you will remember that God's salvation is already present among us.

All: Faced with the troubles and the suffering of the world, we choose to live in joyful presence to God and one another. We will not turn away from the pain and the hurt in our world, and we will not stop rejoicing in God, whose salvation fills us to overflowing that God's love might flow through us and flood our troubled world with hope, peace, and joy.

Reader 2: We light this candle of joy as a sign of our commitment to be present to ourselves, our friends, our families, and our neighbors that in sharing our vulnerable lives we might share in the glorious joy of God's salvation together.

Light the first two blue candles and the third (pink/rose) candle of the Advent wreath.

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■ The Liturgy of the Word

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF ZEPHANIAH

Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! The Lord has taken away the judgements against you, he has turned away your enemies. The king of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more. On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: Do not fear, O Zion; do not let your hands grow weak. The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a warrior who gives victory; he will rejoice over you with gladness, he will renew you in his love; he will exult over you with loud singing as on a day of festival. I will remove disaster from you, so that you will not bear reproach for it. I will deal with all your oppressors at that time. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth. At that time I will bring you home, at the time when I gather you; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes, says the Lord.

REFRAIN Ring out your joy, for the Holy One of Israel is in your midst. Surely, it is God who saves me; I will trust in him and not be afraid. For the Lord is my stronghold and my sure defence, and he will be my Saviour. R

★ The Gospel

May God be with you. And also with you.

The Holy Gospel of our Saviour Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, O Jesus Christ.

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." And the crowds asked him, "What then should we do?" In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He said to them, "Collect no more

than the amount prescribed for you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages." As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

For on the night Jesus was betrayed Jesus took bread, and after giving thanks to you, broke it and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take this and eat it: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

And after supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and after giving thanks, gave it to them and said: "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Let us proclaim the mystery of our faith.

Jesus is Lord. Christ has reconciled us to God. Christ makes all things new.

And so, Heavenly God, rejoicing in Christ's Holy Incarnation; Blessed Passion and Perfect Sacrifice made once for all upon the Cross; Christ's mighty resurrection from the dead; Glorious ascension into heaven; And looking for Christ's coming again in glory; we offer you this bread and this cup. We pray that you will accept this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; and grant that all who eat and drink of the body and blood of your beloved our great high priest, may be renewed by your Holy Spirit, and be one body, one Spirit in Christ.

Let faith and love increase in us. Unite us with all bishops, all other ministers of your Word and Sacraments, and with the whole people of God, living and departed, whom you have made for yourself.

Confirm us in holiness, that we may be found ready to join the company of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Holy Apostles, and all your saints, when Jesus comes again: forever giving you thanks and praise through Jesus from whom all good things do come.

With Christ, and in Christ, and through Christ, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we worship you, God almighty, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, in songs of everlasting praise.

Blessing and Honour and Glory and Power Be yours for even and ever. Amen.


As our Saviour taught us, let us pray,
