Acknowledgement of Territory

Once again, the word is surprised at a manger, as the glory of God surpasses what is expected.

Let us go to Bethlehem and see what God makes known to us.

There in Bethlehem, and today at Christ Church Bolton, we reminded anew of the wonder of God's ways.

Let us glorify and praise God for all that we see and hear!

Amazing God, over 2000 years ago, you gathered a group of unlikely people ~ Mary, Joseph, shepherds and others to be part of a great miracle – the birth of Jesus, our Saviour. Today you seek us out and bring us to the manger. You have gathered this group of unlikely folks to become a holy people, a community of faith. We want to respond, Show us how. May we learn and grow as we wait. Amen.

Narrator ~ In the Genesis story, we hear that God created the word with language. God said, 'Let there be light.' God said, 'Let there be night and day.' God said, 'It is good.' Then in the first chapter of John we hear how this language, the Word, is with God, and Jesus.

Reader~ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him, no one thing came into being, What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people.

The true light, which helps everyone to see, was coming into the world. Jesus was in the world, and Word that shaped the world was in him, yet the world did not know him. Jesus came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. Not to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God.

Advent Wreath

Reader 1: When the people were looking for deliverance, the prophet Micah declared, "But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah...from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient day." But what if Micah is also talking to us, proclaiming, "But you, O Bolton, from you shall come forth for me..." What? What might God be calling forth from us?

All: God invites us to receive the promise of God's salvation and the sustenance of God's mercy and grace, enabling us to live the promise as God-bearers to the world. As Christ was born in Bethlehem, so too we answer God's invitation to have Christ born among us today and every day.

Reader 2: We light this candle of love as a sign of our commitment to live as people of God's promise, a promise of salvation and flourishing for all people that springs forth from God's love for all creation.

Light the first two blue candles, the third rose candle and the fourth blue candle of the Advent wreath.

Narrator ~ In the first chapter of the Gospel of Luke we learn of Mary's willingness to work with God even though what is asked of her will not be easy. Being pregnant when not married is against the rules where and when she lives.

Reader ~ The messenger of God, Gabriel, was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to an unmarried woman engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The young woman's name was Mary. And Gabriel said to her, 'Greetings. favoured one! The Lord is with you.' Mary was very puzzled by his words. Gabriel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now you will conceive, and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there shall be no end.' Mary asked, 'How can this be, since I am unmarried?' The angel said to her, 'the Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; the child to be born will be holy; he will be called the Son of God.' Then Mary said, 'Here I am, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the messenger of God departed from her.

Reader ~ The place of Jesus' birth is in Bethlehem, a small town a few miles south of Jerusalem. But Bethlehem was not Joseph or Mary's hometown. They had to go to Bethlehem because Caesar Augustus had made a law that everyone must be counted in the house where their ancestors had bene born. This was a long trip to travel walking, over 90 kilometres or 60 miles, and it would have been more difficult since Mary was pregnant. Mary spent some of the trip riding on a donkey. When Mary and Joseph came to Bethlehem, the hotel was already filled with people, and there was no place for Mary and Joseph to stay. But there was a stable, where the animals lived, that Joseph and Mary were allowed to rest in.

While we are singing this hymn, Mary and Joseph will take their places at the manger.

O little town of Bethlehem,
how still we see thee lie!
Above thy deep and dreamless sleep
the silent stars go by.
Yet in thy dark streets shineth
the everlasting light;
the hopes and fears of all the years
are met in thee tonight.

For Christ is born of Mary;
and, gathered all above,

Reader ~ In this stable, with only Joseph to help her, Mary gave birth to a baby boy. She wrapped in bands of cloth and laid him in a manger. Mary and Joseph named him Jesus.

Sing: Away in a Manger, verses 1 & 2 Common Praise # 126

While we are singing this hymn, the star will move into place behind the manger.

Away in a manger, no crib for a bed, the little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head; the stars in the bright sky looked down where he lay, the little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.

The cattle are lowing, the baby awakes, but little Lord Jesus, no crying he makes. I love you, Lord Jesus, look down from on high and stay by my side until morning is nigh.

Reader ~ Now it was nighttime and in the fields nearby, shepherds were watching their flocks. Then an angel stood before the shepherds, and the glory of the Lord shone around them. And the shepherds were terrified! But the angel of the Lord said to the shepherds, 'Do not be afraid, for see, I am bringing you good news of great joy for all people: to you is born this day in the city of David, a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you

will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.' Immediately after the angel stopped speaking, there were suddenly many angels praising God, and saying 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among all.'

Sing: Hark! the Herald Angels sing v 1 & 2 Common Praise #138

During this hymn, the angels will come to stand behind the manger.

Reader ~ Then the angels left the shepherds, and the shepherds took a deep breath, or maybe five or six deep breaths. Then they looked at each other and said, 'We better go see this baby!'



Sing: O Come, All ye Faithful v. 1 & 3 Common Praise #118

During this hymn all shepherds will move to surround the manger.

O come, all ye faithful, joyful and triumphant, O come ye, O come ye to Bethlehem! Come, and behold Him, born the king of angels!

Refrain:

O come, let us adore Him;
O come, let us adore Him;
O come, let us adore Him, Christ, the Lord!

Sing, choirs of angels, sing in exultation, Sing, all ye citizens of heaven above; Glory to God in the highest; (Refrain)

Reader ~ So this stable, where Mary, Joseph and Jesus were staying was, as you heard earlier, home to some of the animals of the village. And these animals must have been pretty curious as to what a baby was doing in their feeding trough. If animals have thoughts, some of them have sounded like, 'What are all these people doing in our home?' or 'How can we get our supper with a baby lying in the manger?' So it's quite likely that these animals may have gathered around Joseph, Mary, Jesus and the shepherds for a better look.

Sing: What Child is This Common Praise #137

While we are singing this hymn, all animals will move to the front to take their places around the manger.

What Child is this, who, laid to rest, On Mary's lap is sleeping? Whom angels greet with anthems sweet, While shepherds watch are keeping?

Reader ~ Now when the shepherds saw Mary, Joseph and Jesus in the stable, and saw that what the angel had said to them was true, they went out and made it known to whoever they met. Which means it's very possible that some of the townspeople went to the stable that very night to see and maybe even help the holy family because of what the shepherds had told them. Maybe someone brought them a meal or a warm blanket.

Sing: Go Tell it on the Mountain

While we are singing this hymn, all townspeople will move to the front to see and worship the baby Jesus.

Refrain:

Go tell it on the mountain, over the hills, and ev'rywhere; go, tell it on the mountain that Jesus Christ is born.

While shepherds kept their watching o'er silent flocks by night, behold, throughout the heavens there shone a holy light. [Refrain]

Narrator ~ What a full and busy stable we have made! We are reminded that today we celebrate the birth of Jesus, not just because he was born but because of the life that he lived. The baby Jesus grew into an adult Jesus who chose to live God's way, all the time. This is good news for all of us because we can choose to follow the way of Jesus too. We are all God's sons and daughters. So we give thanks to God for Jesus and for the celebration of Christmas which we will take part in in a few days.
