▼ The Liturgy of the Word

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF NEHEMIAH

All the people gathered together into the square before the Water Gate. They told the scribe Ezra to bring the book of the law of Moses, which the Lord had given to Israel. Accordingly, the priest Ezra brought the law before the assembly, both men and women and all who could hear with understanding. This was on the first day of the seventh month. He read from it facing the square before the Water Gate from early morning until midday, in the presence of the men and the women and those who could understand; and the ears of all the people were attentive to the book of the law. And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was standing above all the people; and when he opened it, all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people answered, "Amen, Amen," lifting up their hands. Then they bowed their heads and worshipped the Lord with their faces to the ground. So they read from the book, from the law of God, with interpretation. They gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading. And Nehemiah, who was the governor, and Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, "This day is holy to the Lord your God; do not mourn or weep." For all the people wept when they heard the words of the law. Then he said to them, "Go your way, eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions of them to those for whom nothing is prepared, for this day is holy to our Lord; and do not be grieved, for the joy of the Lord is your strength."

NEHEMIAH 8:1-3, 5-6, 8-10

Listen for the leading of the Spirit. Thanks be to God.

The heavens declare the glory of God, and the firmament shows his handiwork.

One day tells its tale to another, and one night imparts knowledge to another.

Although they have no words or language, and their voices are not heard,

Their sound has gone out into all lands, and their message to the ends of the world.

In the deep has he set a pavilion for the sun; it comes forth like a bridegroom out of his chamber; it rejoices like a champion to run its course.

It goes forth from the uttermost edge of the heavens and runs about to the end of it again; nothing is hidden from its burning heat.

The law of the Lord is perfect and revives the soul; the testimony of the Lord is sure and gives wisdom to the innocent.

The statutes of the Lord are just and rejoice the heart; the commandment of the Lord is clear and gives light to the eyes.

The fear of the Lord is clean and endures for ever; the judgements of the Lord are true and righteous altogether.

More to be desired are they than gold, more than much fine gold, sweeter far than honey, than honey in the comb.

By them also is your servant enlightened, and in keeping them there is great reward.

Who can tell how often he offends? cleanse me from my secret faults.

Above all, keep your servant from presumptuous sins; let them not get dominion over me; then shall I be whole and sound, and innocent of a great offense.

Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O Lord, my strength and my redeemer.

The Holy Gospel of our Saviour Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, O Jesus Christ.

Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone. When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour." And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."

It is indeed right; it is our duty and joy at all times and in all places to give you thanks and praise Holy God, heavenly Ruler, Almighty and eternal God through Jesus Christ your beloved, for Jesus is your living Word; through Jesus you have created all things from the beginning, and formed us in your

own image. Through Jesus you have freed us from the slavery of sin, giving him to be born as a human and to die upon the cross; You raised Christ from the dead and exalted him to your right hand on high, through Jesus you have sent upon us Your holy and life-giving Spirit, and made us a people for your own possession.

Therefore, with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, forever praising you and singing:

Accept our praises heavenly God, through your beloved, our saviour Jesus Christ; and as we follow Christ's example and obey Jesus' command, grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be to us Christ's body and blood; Who in the same night that he was betrayed took bread and gave you thanks; broke it and gave it to the disciples saying: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; Do this in remembrance of me,"

In the same way, after supper, Jesus took the cup and gave you thanks, gave it to them saying: "Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Christ has died, Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Therefore, heavenly God, we remember Christ's offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; and proclaim Christ's mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, As we look for Jesus' coming in glory, we celebrate with this bread and this cup that one perfect sacrifice.

Accept through Jesus, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of thanks and praise; and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of your divine Majesty, renew us by your Spirit, inspire us with your love, and unite us in the body of your beloved Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through Jesus Christ, by whom, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven. We worship you, God Almighty, In songs of everlasting praise.

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen.

"I am the bread of life," says the Lord.


"Whoever comes to me will never be hungry; whoever believes in me will never thirst."


