
Acknowledgement of Territory

▼ The Liturgy of the Word

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF ACTS

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them. We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshipper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.

Let your ways be known upon earth, your saving health among all nations.


Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you.

It is right to give God thanks and praise.

It is right to praise you, God of all creation; in your love you made us for yourself. When we turned away you did not reject us, but came to meet us in Jesus.

You embraced us as your children and welcomed us to sit and eat with you.

In Christ you shared our life that we might live through Christ, and Christ in us. Jesus opened the arms of love upon the cross and made for all the perfect sacrifice for sin.

Jesus put an end to death, revealed the resurrection, and in the power of the Holy Spirit made us your own people.

On the night he was betrayed, at supper with friends he took bread and gave you thanks; broke it and gave it to them, saying; "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; Do this in memory of me."

We do this in remembrance of Jesus: the body of Christ is the bread of life.

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, Jesus gave you thanks, and said: "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me."

We do this in remembrance of Jesus: the blood of Christ is shed for all.

On the day that Jesus rosea from the tomb Christ walked and talked with disciples on the road to Emmaus, but they were kept from recognizing Jesus; and as Jesus shared supper with them in their home, Jesus again took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Their eyes were opened and Jesus was revealed to them in the breaking of the bread, and they recognized their saviour.

We do this in remembrance of Jesus: the risen one revealed in the breaking of the bread.

So we proclaim the mystery of faith Christ has died Christ is risen Christ will come again. Alleluia!

As we proclaim Christ's death and celebrate Jesus rising in glory, send your Holy Spirit that this bread and this wine may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son.

As we eat and drink these holy gifts, send your Spirit upon us, and make us one in Christ, our risen God. Alleluia!

With your whole church throughout the world we offer you this sacrifice of praise and lift our voice to join in the eternal song of heaven:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest Blessed is he who comes in the name of God. Hosanna in the highest. Amen.

Now we share in your resurrection.


