



## ★ The Gathering of the Community

Acknowledgement of Territory

Dear friends in Christ,

during Lent we have been preparing for the celebration of our Lord's paschal mystery. On this day our Lord Jesus Christ entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph. The people welcomed him with palms and shouts of praise, but the path before him led to self-giving, suffering, and death. Today we greet him as our King, although we know his crown is thorns and his throne a cross. ## **▼** The Liturgy of the Palms

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark

When the disciples were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

MARK 11:1-11

Listen for the leading of the Spirit. Thanks be to God.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right to praise you, almighty God, for the acts of love by which you have redeemed us through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. The Hebrews acclaimed Jesus as Messiah and King, with palm branches in their hands, crying, Hosanna in the highest. May we also, carrying these emblems, go forth to meet Christ and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who lives and reigns in glory with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen.**

## ★ The Liturgy of the Passion

A Reading from the Book of Isaiah

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens—wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backward. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. The Lord God helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty?

#### **№ PSALM 31:9-16**

Have mercy upon me, O Lord, for I am in trouble; my eye is consumed with sorrow, and also my throat and my belly.

My times are in your hand; rescue me from the hand of my enemies, and from those who persecute me.


Make your face to shine upon your servant, and in your loving-kindness save me."

## Glory to you, O Jesus Christ



Many Readers for the Gospel in Parts

## Gethsemane (Mark 14: 32-42)

Reader 1: Jesus and the disciples went to a place called Gethsemane; and Jesus

said to the disciples:

Jesus: Sit here, while I pray.

Reader 1: He took with him Peter and James and John and began to be greatly

distressed and troubled. Jesus said to them,

Jesus: I am deeply grieved, even to death; stay here and keep awake.

Reader 1: Going a little farther, he fell on the ground and prayed that, if it were

possible, the hour might pass from him. He said,

Jesus: Abba, Father, all things are possible to you; remove this cup from me; yet,

not what I want, but what you want.

Reader 1: Then he came and found them sleeping, and he said to Peter,

Jesus: Simon, are you asleep? Could you not watch one hour? Keep awake and

pray that you may not come to the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing,

but the flesh is weak.

Reader 1: Again he went away and prayed. Once more he came and found them

sleeping, for their eyes were very heavy; and they did not know what to

say to him. And he came a third time and said to them,

Jesus: Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? It is enough; the hour has

come; the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Get up, let

us be going; see, my betrayer is at hand.

## Jesus Arrested (Mark 14: 43-52)

Reader 1: Immediately, while he was still speaking, Judas, one of the twelve, arrived, and with him there was a crowd with swords and clubs, from the chief priests, the scribes and the elders. Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying,

Judas: The one I will kiss is the man; seize him and lead him away under guard.

Reader 1: So when he came, he went up to Jesus at once and said,

Judas: Master!

Reader 1: And he kissed him. Then they laid hands on him and arrested him. But one of those who stood by drew his sword, and struck the slave of the high priest, and cut off his ear. Jesus said to them,

Jesus: Have you come out with swords and clubs to arrest me as though I were a bandit? Day after day I was with you in the temple teaching, and you did not seize me. But let the scriptures be fulfilled.

Reader 1: All of them deserted him and fled.

## Jesus before the Council (Mark 14: 53-65)

Reader 2: They led Jesus to the high priest, and all the chief priests, the elders and the scribes were assembled. Peter had followed at a distance, right into the courtyard of the high priest, and he was sitting with the guards, warming himself at the fire. Now the chief priests and the whole council were looking for testimony against Jesus to put him to death, but they found none. Some stood up and bore false witness against him. Some said,

Everyone (crowd): We heard him say, 'I will destroy this temple that is made with hands, and in three days I will build another, not made with hands.'

Reader 2: But even on this point their testimony did not agree. The high priest stood up before them and asked Jesus,

High Priest: Have you no answer? What is it that they testify against you?

Reader 2: But he was silent and did not answer. Again the high priest asked him,

High Priest: Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed One?

Reader 2: And Jesus said,

Jesus: I am, and you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of God, and coming with the clouds of heaven.

Reader 2: The high priest tore his clothes and said,

High Priest: Why do we still need witnesses? You have heard his blasphemy. What is your decision?

Reader 2: All of them condemned him as deserving death. Some began to spit on him and to blindfold him and to strike him, saying to him,

## Everyone (crowd): Prophesy!

Reader 2: The guards also took him and beat him.

## Peter's Denial (Mark 14: 66-72)

Reader 3: While Peter was below in the courtyard, one of the servant-girls of the high priest came. When she saw Peter warming himself, she stared at him and said.

Girl: You also were with Jesus, the man from Nazareth.

Reader 3: He denied it, saying,

Peter: I do not know or understand what you are talking about.

Reader 3: He went out onto the forecourt. Then the cock crowed. The servant-girl, on seeing him, began again to say to the bystanders,

Girl: This man is one of them.

Reader 3: But again Peter denied it. After a little while the bystanders said to Peter,

## Everyone(crowd): Certainly you are one of them, for you are a Galilean.

Reader 3: But Peter began to curse, and he swore an oath,

Peter: I do not know the man!

Reader 3: At that moment the cock crowed for the second time. Then Peter remembered that Jesus had said to him, 'Before the cock crows twice, you will deny me three times.' And he broke down and wept.

## The Trial before Pilate (Mark 15: 1-15)

Reader 4: As soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council. They bound Jesus, led him away and handed him over to Pilate. Pilate asked him.

Pilate: Are you the King of the Jews?

Reader 4: And Jesus answered,

Jesus: You say so.

Reader 4: The chief priests accused him of many things. Pilate asked him again,

Pilate: Have you no answer? See how many charges they bring against you!

Reader 4: Jesus made no further reply, so that Pilate was amazed. Now at the festival Pilate used to release a prisoner for them, anyone for whom they asked. Now a man called was in prison with the rebels who had committed murder during the insurrection. The crowd came and began to ask Pilate to do for them according to his custom. Pilate asked them,

Pilate: Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?

Reader 4: For Pilate perceived that it was out of jealousy that the chief priests had handed him over. But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release Barabbas instead. Then Pilate spoke to them again,

Pilate: Then what do you wish me to do with the man you call the King of the Jews?

Reader 4: They shouted back,

Everyone (crowd): Crucify him!

Reader 4: Pilate asked them,

Pilate: Why, what evil has he done?

Reader 4: But they shouted all the more,

Everyone (crowd): Crucify him!

Reader 4: So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas for them; and after having Jesus flogged, he handed him over to be crucified.



## The Road to Golgotha (Mark 15: 16-23)

Reader 5: The soldiers led Jesus into the courtyard of the palace and called together the whole cohort. Then they clothed him in a purple cloak, and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on his head. They began saluting him, saying,

## Everyone (the crowd): Hail, King of the Jews!

Reader 5: They struck his head with a reed, and spat upon him, and they knelt down in homage to him. And after mocking him, they stripped him of his purple cloak, and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him out to crucify him. They compelled a passer-by, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, to carry his cross. They brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha, which means the place of a skull. And they offered him wine mixed with myrrh but he did not take it.



## The Crucifixion (Mark 15: 24-32)


Reader 5: They crucified Jesus, and divided his garments among them, casting lots for them to decide what each should take. It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him. The inscription of the charge against him read 'The King of the Jews.' And with him they crucified two bandits, one on his right and one on his left. Those who passed by derided him, shaking their heads and saying,

Everyone (crowd): Aha! You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself, and come down from the cross!

Reader 5: In the same way the chief priests, along with the scribes, mocked him, saying to one another,

Everyone (crowd): He saved others; he cannot save himself. Let the Messiah, the King of Israel, come down now from the cross, so that we may see and believe.

Reader 5: Those who were crucified with him also taunted him.



## The Death of Jesus (Mark 15: 33-39)

Reader 5: When it was noon, darkness came over the land until three in the

afternoon. At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice,

Jesus: Eloi, eloi, lama sabachthani?

Reader 5: Which means,

Jesus: My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

Reader 5: When some of the bystanders heard it, one of them said,

Man: Listen, he is calling Elijah.

Reader 5: Someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it

to him to drink, saying,

Man: : Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down.

Reader 5: Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. The curtain of the

temple was torn in two from top to bottom. Now when the centurion, who

stood facing him, saw that he had died, exclaimed,

Centurion: Truly this man was the Son of God!

The Gospel of Christ. Praise to you, O Jesus Christ.

## ▼ Profession of Faith ~ the Apostles' Creed

Glory and Thanksgiving be to you, most loving creator, for Christ in whom the world is reconciled. Lifted on the Cross, Jesus' suffering and forgiveness spanned the gulf our sins had made. Through that dark struggle death was swallowed up in victory, that light and life might reign.

Before he was given up to suffering and death, recalling the night of Israel's release, the night in which the children of Egypt died, your Chosen One, himself the first-born, freely offered his life.

At supper with his disciples Jesus took bread and offered you thanks, he broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: "Take, eat. this is my body: it is broken for you." After supper, Jesus took the cup, offered you thanks, and gave it to them, saying: "Drink this all of you. This is the blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you and for all, that sins may be forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me."

We now obey your son's command. We recall his blessed passion and death, glorious resurrection and ascension; And we look for the coming of Christ's Kingdom. Made one with Christ, we offer you these gifts and with them, we offer ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice. Hear us O merciful God, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by the life-giving power of Jesus they may be his Body and Blood, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your kingdom.

Help us, who are baptized into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, the apostles and prophets, and all of our brothers and sisters living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ, by whom, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, God of all ages, world without end. Amen.

We break this bread,


Communion in Christ's body once broken.




## **№ Prayer after Communion**
